The banquet will begin with a reception and art exhibition celebrating the legacy and longevity of the Denver Women's Chorus, followed by dinner, speakers, musical performances, a silent auction and our drawing for a trip to New York City.

Musical performances by the Denver Women's Chorus include selections drawn from their extensive repertoire. Songs include *Imani*, *Lineage*, *Juntos*, *I Ain't Afraid*, *Step by Step* and *You Are My Music*.
